





# PRIORITY I: FUNDED POLICY DEVELOPMENT

- National carers strategy in place since 2012
- "Cost-neutral" strategy no longer appropriate

- Not in sync with other relevant policies
  - National Dementia Strategy
  - National Youth Strategy
  - National Disability strategy
  - National Ageing Strategy etc.


- Opportunity to lead by example solid actions that are specific in their remit (ref NCS 2012, UK Carers Action Plan 2018-2020)
- Need to involve every single Government department because carers issues cross every department
- Needs a dedicated budget and action plan
- Need to involve minority/ hidden groups (see Discussion Paper 9 for more details)
- EuroCarers towards an EU Strategy?

# PRIORITY 2: FUNDING OF SERVICES AND SUPPORTS

- Much of our member feedback highlights lack of appropriate investment in crucial services
  - Home Care
  - Access to respite
  - Disability specific services
  - Access to mental health supports

### SPECIFIC EXAMPLE: HOME CARE

- In spite of increased resourcing since 2014 now up to €430m p. a (10% reduction in hours in 2011/12)
- Less Access (utilization ratio) than in 2008
  - 40% increase in aged 65+ population (NB 80+ population)
- Duration of Waiting Lists > 3 months
- Level of unmet need > 18%
- ESRI 2017 Report c60% increase in demand 2015-2030
- Timely and high quality Home Care supports families to continue to care at home



# PRIORITY 3: ADDRESSING POVERTY AND INCOME INEQUALITY

- Welcome the allocation of a budget for research into the Cost of Disability and Caring in Budget 2019
- Understand the budgetary limitations for allowance increases
- FC's more likely to live on or below poverty lines
- Creative solutions can be found refreshed NCS?
- Look at work & care encouraging employers (not just state employers) to understand needs of working carers
